

Mr. Dail reported a bill entitled, an act for the preservation of fish in the waters of Talbot, Dorchester and Caroline counties.

Mr. Reeder reported a bill entitled, an act to allow Edward R. Wheeler, late sheriff of Charles county, further time to complete his collections ; and

Mr. Harris reported a bill entitled, an act to change the name of the village in Cecil county, known by the name of Harris's Cross Roads to that of Harrisville ;

Which were severally read the first, and by a special order the second time, severally passed and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Shriver from the select committee, made a favorable report upon the bill from the Senate entitled, an act for the benefit of the Evangelical Lutheran Church, in Frederick Town ;

Mr. Lynch from the select committee, made a favorable report upon the bill from the Senate entitled, an act for the benefit of Henry M. Jamison, and

Mr. Harris made a favorable report upon the bill from the Senate entitled, an act to regulate the appointment of the steward or overseer of Cecil county alms house ;

Which were severally read the first and by a special order the second time, severally passed and returned to the Senate.

Mr. Yellott from the select committee, made a favorable report upon the bill from the Senate entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to incorporate the Mutual Fire Insurance Company, in Harford county, passed at December session 1842 ;

The said bill was then read the first, and by a special order the second time, passed and returned to the Senate.

Mr. Ligon reported a bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Howard Lyceum of Ellicott's Mills :

Which was read the first, and by a special order the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Ecker, chairman of the select committee, to which was referred the bill from the Senate entitled, an act for the benefit of Thomas Hook, reported the same with the following amendment:

Amendment proposed.

"Strike out the second section of the bill."

The amendment having been assented to.

The said bill was then read the first, and by a special order the second time, passed with the proposed amendment and returned to the Senate.

Mr. Potter, chairman of the committee on Education, submitted the following resolution :

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That instead of the sum of eight hundred dollars heretofore payable out of the Treasury of this State yearly, under the act of 1835, ch. 204, as a donation to Upper Marlboro' academy, in Prince George's county, the Treasurer shall hereafter pay to, or for the use of said academy annually, the sum of four hundred dollars, and no more; and that the Treasurer is hereby directed to pay to, or for the use of Bladensburgh academy, in said county, as a donation to said in-
