So the House refused to suspend the rules.

Mr. Thomas, of Anne Arundel reported a bill entitled, an act  
for the relief of primary schools in Howard District ;

Which was read the first and by a special order the second time,  
passed and sent to the Senate

Mr. Ligon from the committee on Corporations, to which was  
referred the bill from the Senate entitled, a further supplement to  
an act entitled, an act to incorporate the Maryland Mining Com-  
pany, reported the same without amendment ;

The said bill was then read the first, and by a special order the  
second time.

On motion of Mr. McKaig,

Said bill was amended by adding at the end thereof as an addi-  
tional section the following :

Sec. 4. And be it enacted, That the stockholder's meetings of  
the company, shall be called by ten days previous notice, in one  
newspaper printed in the Town of Cumberland, and one in the  
city of Baltimore.

Mr. Fitzpatrick moved further to amend said bill by adding at  
the end thereof, as an additional section the following :

Sec. 5 And be it enacted, That in all cases in which a jury  
shall or may be empanelled, for the purpose of ascertaining the com-  
pensation, and damages due to individuals for property taken or con-  
demned, for the use of said company, the jury in making and render-  
ing their verdict, shall not take into consideration, or make any  
allowance, or set off, for or on account of any benefit, advantage, or  
convenience, which might accrue to any individual, by the con-  
struction of said rail road, or any part thereof :

Determined in the negative.

On motion of Mr. Fitzpatrick,

The yeas and nays were ordered and appeared as follows :

So the amendment was rejected.

The question then recurred and was put,

"Shall the said bill pass?"

Resolved in the affirmative,

And the bill returned to the Senate.
