Mr. Kilgour moved the previous question, and being demanded by a majority of the members present.

The question was then put,

"Will the House adopt the order as amended?"

Determined in the negative.

Mr. Chapman presented the memorlal of the trustees district school No. 3, in 4th district of Charles county asking to be permitted to change the scite of the school;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Chapman, Reeder and

Freeman.

On motion of Mr. Potter,

Leave was granted the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, to bring in a bill to allow married women between eighteen and twenty-one years of age, to have and receive possession of their real and personal estate from all other persons, as well as executors, administrators or guardians.

On motion of Mr. Potter,

Leave was granted the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, to bring in a bill further to secure the rights of married women.

Mr. Weber from the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, made an unfavorable report upon the memorial of the directors of the Eastern Dispensary of the city of Baltimore, praying the passage of an act granting a share pro rata of the fines &c., which are now by law granted to the General Dispensary, and to alter the mode of electing officers;

Which was twice read, and On motion of Mr. Semmes, Said report was recommitted.

Mr. Semmes reported a bill entitled, an act for the relief of Eli

S. Baldwin, sheriff of Prince George's county.

Mr. Chapman chairman of the committee on Corporations, reported a bill entitled, an act to incorporate the trustees of the Methodist Episcopal Church of Hagerstown.

Mr. Yellott chairman of the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, reported a bill entitled, an act to authorise the sale and conveyance of certain property therein mentioned;

Which were severally read the first and by a special order the

second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Chapman chairman of the committee on Corporations, made a favorable report upon the bill reported by Mr. Shriver entitled, an act to incorporate the Mutual Insurance Company of Frederick;

The said bill was then read the first and by a special order the

second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Yellott, chairman of the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, reported a bill entitled, an act to cure a defect in the acknowledgement of a deed therein mentioned;

Which was read the first and by a special order the second

time, passed and sent to the Senate.
