First on the amendment proposed by Mr. Thomas, of Talbot, to the amendment offered by Mr. Phelps, and

Determined in the affirmative.

The question was then put on the amendment as offered by Mr. Phelps, and amended on the motion of Mr. Thomas, of Talbot, and

Determined in the affirmative.

The question then recurred and was put, on the order as amended, and

Resolved in the affirmative

Mr. Phelps submitted the following order:

Ordered, That all business transacted during the balance of the session, shall be taken up and disposed of in conformity to the written rules of the House, and that all motions for the suspension of the rules to take up any subject out of its regular place, except for to give a local bill a second reading by special order, be taken by yeas and nays;

Which was twice read and rejected. On motion of Mr. Ghiselin,

Leave was granted the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, to bring in a bill to amend the act of 1794, ch. 54, entitled, an act for the amendment of the law in certain cases.

Mr. Potter reported a bill entitled, an act to authorise the location of a Female school in the town of Denton, in Caroline coun-

ty.

Mr. Stewart reported a bill entitled, an act to change the name of William V. Wroten, of Dorchester county to William Vance Wilson.

Mr. McKaig from the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, reported a bill entitled, an act to amend an act to incorporate the Allegany Mining Company, passed December session 1835, ch. 326, and

Mr. Thomas, of Anne Arundel, reported a bill entitled, an act for the encouragement of primary schools in Howard District;

Which were severally read the first, and by a special order the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Stansbury, of Baltimore county, reported a bill entitled, an

act for the relief of Nathan F. Comly;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Colored Population.

Mr. Calvert reported a bill entitled, a further supplement to an act entitled, an act to incorporate a company for the purpose of cutting and making a canal between the river Delaware and the Chesapeake bay;

Which was read, and Ordered to be printed.

Mr. Franklin reported a bill entitled, an act to alter and change the place of holding the election in the first election district in Worcester county;

Mr. Dalrymple reported a bill entitled, an act for the relief of

Loach L. Weems;
