Mr. Johnson reported a bill entitled, an act to divide the second election district of Anne Arundel county, and

Mr. Smith reported a bill entitled, an act to regulate the height of fences in the sixth election district of Allegany county ;

Which were severally read the first, and by a special order the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Harrison, chairman of select committee, to which was referred the bill from the Senate, entitled, an act relating to the justices of the magistrates court, in Queen Anne's county, reported the same with the following amendment.

Amendment proposed.

Strike out all after the word "dollars," in the fourth line, second section ;

Which was read and assented to.

The said bill was then read the first and by a special order the second time, passed with the proposed amendment, and returned to the Senate.
