time of Thomas W. De Coursey, former collector of Queen Anne's county, to complete his collections, reported the same with the following amendment.

Amendment proposed.

Strike out in the 4th line, 1st section "twentieth day of October," and insert "first day of June."

Which amendment was read and assented to.

The said bill was then read the first and by a special order the second time, passed with the proposed amendment and returned to the Senate.

The bill reported by Mr. Chapman, chairman of the committee on Corporations, entitled, an act to extend the charter of the Washington County Bank, at Williamsport, in Washington county, being the unfinished busines of Thursday the 22nd instant, was taken up for consideration;

Mr. Stewart moved to amend said bill by adding at the end

thereof, as an additional section the following:

Sec. 9. "And be it enacted, That nothing herein contained shall be construed to deprive the State, at any time of the right to revoke or modify the charter of said bank."

Determined in the negative.

Was taken up for consideration, and read the second time.

Said bill was ordered to lie on the table.

The bill reported by Mr. Curley entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to regulate the inspection of lumber in the city and county of Baltimore;
