Which was read and referred to the joint delegations of Fred-

erick and Montgomery counties.

Mr. Keene presented the petition of Lewis Willson, of Caroline county, praying the passage of a law to alter and change the names of his two children, from Francis Hubbard and Sarah Elmira Hubbard, to that of Francis Willson and Sarah Elmria Willson:

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Keene, McKnett and

Potter.

Mr. Hopkins presented the petition of James A. Gover, John Mitchell and L. Hoyte and Costen, praying for a law to correct certain grievances therein mentioned;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Grievances

and Courts of Justice.

Mr. Wade presented a preamble and resolutions adopted by a mass meeting of the citizens of district No. 1 in Washington county, praying the passage of a law to enable the President and Directors of the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal Company, to complete the canal to Cumberland, signed by the President and Vice President of said meeting;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Internal Im-

provement.

Mr. Calvert presented the memorial of forty-four citizens of Prince George's county, praying the passage of a law, to prohibit Attorneys from charging commissions on claims collected by them;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Grievances

and Courts of Justice.

Mr. Buckey presented the petition of sundry citizens of Frederick county, in relation to the commissioners of the tax for said county;

Which was read referred to the Frederick county delega-

tion.

On motion of Mr. Stansbury, of Baltimore county.

Ordered, That the Adjutant General inform this House, as early as possible, the number and character of the arms and accourrements furnished the State of Maryland, by the General Government under the act of 1808, and how many of them are now in the public armorys, and where the remainder are at this time, and what security there is for their safe return.

On motion of Mr. Lankford,

Ordered, That it be entered on the journal, that Mr. Waters of Somerset, is absent from his seat to-day from indisposition.

Mr. Purnell from the committee on Colored Population, reported a bill entitled, an act to repeal a part of the second section of an act passed at December session 1831, chapter 323;

Which was read the first time, and

Ordered to lie on the table.

The clerk of the Senate returned the bill entitled, an act to regulate the form of the corn barrel in this State.
