On motion of Mr. Shriver,

Leave was granted Messrs. Shriver, Thomas of Frederick, Lynch, Naill and Buckey, to bring in a bill to enable the guardian of the heir of Joseph Elder deceased, late of Frederick county, to receive said heir estate. The guardian and heir both being residents of the State of Ohio.

Mr. Franklin presented the petition of sundry citizens of Worcester county, praying the passage of a law, to lay out and open a road in said county;
