Mr. Ghiselin, chairman of the committee on Colored Population, reported a bill entitled, an act for the relief of Nathan F. Conley;

Which was read the first and by a special order the second

time, passed and sent to the Senate.

On motion of Mr. Yellott,

(Seconded by two other members that voted in the majority,) the House reconsidered their vote upon the bill from the Senate, entitled, an act to authorise John Newcomet, former sheriff of Washington county, to execute a certain deed.

On motion of Mr. Yellott, Said bill was recommitted.

The bill reported by Mr. Freeman entitled, an act regulating fishing on the Potomac river during certain months, and concerning obstructions to fishing on said river;

Was taken up for consideration On motion of Mr. Lankford.

Said bill was ordered to lie on the table.

The bill reported by Mr. Curley entitled, an act for the benefit of Eliza Matthews, and others;

Was taken up for consideration. On motion of Mr. Carey,

Said bill was amended by adding at the end thereof, the following as an additional section:

"Be it enacted, That this a t shall not go into effect unless approved by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore;"

Mr. Curley moved to strike out the enacting clause of the bill;

Resolved in the affirmative,

The bill reported by Mr. McKaig entitled, an act supplementary to the several acts for the repair and preservation of that part of the United State's road within the limits of the State of Maryland;

Was taken up for consideration, and read the second time;

On the question being put, "Shall the said bill pass?"

It was determined in the negative. On motion of Mr. Fitzpatrick,
