On motion of Mr. Warfield, well and the street and street and street and the

Leave was granted the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, to bring in a bill requiring plaintiffs at the appearance term, to give security for all costs that may accrue on suits they have instituted.

Mr. Calvert submitted the following resolution:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore, be and he is hereby authorised and required to pay James Coulter, fifty dollars out of any money unappropriated in the treasury, for services rendered to the House of Delegates.
