Which was read.

Mr. Weber offered as a substitute for said report, a bill entitled, an act relating to mortgages and bills of sale;

Which was read, and the report and substitute ordered to lie on

the table, and the bill ordered to be printed.

Mr. Chapman, chairman of the committee on Corporations, reported a bill entitled, an act to incorporate a Literary Institution in Washington county, under the name of the College of Saint James;

Which was read the first and second time by a special order;

On motion of Mr. Hollman,

Said bill was amended by adding at the end thereof as an additional section the following:

"And be it enacted, That this charter, shall be revocable at any

time hereafter by the Legislature of this State."

On motion of Mr. Murray,

Said bill was further amended by adding at the end thereof as

an additional section the following:

"And be it enacted, That the trustees and faculty of said college shall make a yearly report, of the state of the institution to the Governor of the State, to be by him laid before Legislature;"

The said bill was then passed as amended and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Lynch reported a bill entitled, an act to lay out and open a
road through a part of Frederick and Montgomery counties;

Which was read the first and by a special order the second

time:

Mr. Shriver moved to amend said bill by striking out in the 1st section, third line the word "three," and inserting in lieu thereof "one from each county;"

Determined in the negative.

Mr. Shriver then moved to strike out the enacting clause of the bill;

Determined in the negative.

The said bill was then passed, and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Yellott chairman of the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, to which was referred the bill reported by Mr. Shriver, entitled, an act for the benefit of Catherine E. Flemming of Frederick county, reported unfavorably thereon and recommended the rejection of said bill;

Which was twice read, the report concurred in and the bill re-

jected.

The hour having arrived for taking up the order of the day;

The House then resumed the consideration of the order of the day, being the bill reported by Mr. Wootten, chairman of the committee on Internal Improvement entitled, an act to provide for the completion of the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal to Cumberland, and for other purposes;

The question before the House being upon the motion of Mr. Poultney, to reconsider the vote of the House on the 21st instant, upon the amendment offered by Mr. Calvert, and adopted by the
