

Which was twice read and concurred in.

Mr. Yellott, chairman, of the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, made unfavorable reports upon the following petitions, viz :

The memorial of C. Richards, Lewis Jones, James Webb, and others, praying the passage of an act to prohibit the publishing of the names of individuals who apply for the benefit of the insolvent laws ;

The petition of certain creditors of W. H. Hays, praying for the sale of his real estate ;

Also, the petition of sundry citizens of Prince George's county, in relation to a change of the law requiring the advertising of property by sheriffs, &c. and

The leave to introduce a bill to regulate the fees of constables in certain cases ;

Which were severally read the first and by special order the second time and severally concurred in.

Mr. Buckey from the select committee, made an unfavorable report upon the petitions of sundry citizens of Frederick county, severally praying for the repeal of the magistrates' court law for Frederick county ;

Which was twice read and concurred in.

Mr. Yellott, chairman of same committee, to which was referred the bill from the Senate entitled, an act relating to the speedy recovery of small debts, and to authorise the issuing of attachments in certain cases, reported the same without amendment ;

Which was read the first time, and

Mr. Waters, of Somerset, from the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to authorise Joshua C. Gist, executor of Thomas Barnes, of Carroll county, to make and execute certain deeds and conveyances, made a favorable report upon said bill ;

Which was read the first and by special order the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Ghiselin reported a bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Joseph R. Eccleston, of Dorchester county ;

Mr. Yellott, chairman of the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, reported a bill entitled, an act to carry into effect the agreement therein mentioned, between the trustees of Alexander McDonald, late of the city of Baltimore, deceased, and the executors of Adam Welsh, also, of said city, deceased ;

Mr. Wootten reported a bill entitled, an act for the relief of Charles Bowie, of Prince George's county ;

Mr. Potter from the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, reported a bill entitled, a supplement to the act of 1794, ch. 54, entitled, an act for the amendment of the law in certain cases ;
