

On motion of Mr. Walker,

Leave was granted Messrs. Walker, Welsh and Carroll, to bring in a bill, to make valid a deed therein mentioned.

On motion of Mr. Chapman,

Ordered, That the Executive communication, covering resolutions and proceedings of other State governments, be referred to the committee on printing, with instructions to have such portions of the communication printed, as the committee may think necessary.

On motion of Mr. McKaig,

Leave was granted the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, to bring in a bill, to amend the act of 1825, chapter 223, relating to the form of taking supercedeas on judgements of justices of the peace.

On motion of Mr. Franklin,

Ordered, That the Treasurer of the State of Maryland, be required to report to this house, the first cost of all the tobacco ware houses belonging to the State, together with all additional cost and expenses laid out on the same by way of repairs or otherwise, and also, all sums paid out to the officers, laborers and others, as well as the amount of revenues which the State has received from said ware houses, designating the receipts and expenditures of each year separately.

On motion of Mr. Hopewell,

Ordered, That James H. Lockett of the city of Baltimore, be and he is hereby appointed a director on the part of the State, in the Bank of Baltimore.

On motion of Mr. Nail,

Leave was granted Messrs. Nail, Buckey, Lynch, Thomas of Frederick and Shriver, to bring in a bill, in relation to judges and clerks of election in Frederick county.

On motion of Mr. Waters of Montgomery,

Ordered, That the clerks and other officers to the House of Delegates, have free access to, and use of the State Library, as the members of the legislature now have.

On motion of Mr. Reeder,

Ordered, That the agent of the State Colonization Society, report to this house the amount of money received and expended, since the organization of the society, and the number of free people of color, transported from the State, by said society, and the number specifically from each county, and also the amount of money now in the treasury, and that the amount which each county, has respectively paid in, be also reported.

On motion of Mr. Dalrymple,

Leave was granted Messrs. Dalrymple, Weems and Allnut, to bring in a bill to allow Francis Stevens, sheriff of Calvert county, further time to bond.

On motion of Mr. Lankford,
