Also, the bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to revise and amend an act entitled, an act to provide for the appointment of commissioners for the regulation and improvement of the town of Cumberland in Allegany county, and to incorporate the same, passed at December session 1834, chapter 237;

Also, the bill entitled, an act to incorporate the trustees of the

Methodist Episcopal Church of Hagerstown;

Also, the bill entitled, an act to authorise commission to take testimony to issue in cases of appeals from the decisions of single magistrates, and the district courts of Charles county;

Severally endorsed, "will not pass."

Also, the resolution in favor of Samuel Brittingham;

Endorsed, "dissented from."

And delivered the following bills originated in and passed by the Senate, viz:

A bill entitled, an act to change the place of holding elections in the third or Berlin district in Worcester county;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Franklin, Hearn and

A bill entitled, an act to abolish imprisonment for debt in the

State of Matyland, and

A bill entitled, an act to authorise and empower the several county courts in this State to issue commissions to take testimony in cases therein mentioned;

Which were severally read and referred to the committee on

Grievances and Courts of Justice.

The bill reported by Mr. Johnson, chairman of the committee n Ways and Means, entitled, an act to cause a State Board of Equilization, with power to equalize the value of property in this State, directed to be assessed and valued under the act for the general valuation and assessment of property in this State, passed at March session 1841, ch. 23;

Was taken up for consideration. On motion of Mr. Yellott.

Said bill was recommitted.

The bill reported by Mr. Johnson, chairman of same committeeentitled, an act imposing a tax on collateral inheritances, distributive shares and legacies, to aid in paying the debt of the State;

Was taken up for consideration.
