

Leave was granted Messrs. Lankford, Yellott, Poultney, Carey and Keene, to bring in a bill, to repeal the act of Dec. session 1837. chapter 310.

On motion of Mr. Ligon,

Ordered, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore, be required to ascertain and report to this House, as early as practicable, a statement of all balances due the State from the State debtors — showing names and amounts.

Mr. Kilgour chairman of the committee on Claims, delivered a report of the accounts of George Mackubin, late Treasurer of the Western Shore, from 1st December 1842, to 9th March, 1843, inclusive;

On motion of Mr. Kilgour,

Ordered to be printed, with the accompanying documents.

On motion of Mr. Johnson,

Leave was granted the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, to report a bill entitled, a supplement to the act regulating writs of error, and granting appeals to the court of appeals.

Mr. Cathell obtained leave to bring in a bill to prevent obstructions in the Pocomoke river in Worcester county;

Which was read and referred to the delegations from Worcester and Somerset counties.

On motion of Mr. Kilgour,

Leave was granted Messrs. Kilgour, Griffith and Trundle, to bring in a bill, entitled, an act for fixing the place of holding elections in Rockville District, Montgomery county.

On motion of Mr. Calvert,

Ordered, That the committee on Ways and Means, enquire into the expediency of disposing of the different bank stocks, held by the State and appropriating the proceeds thereof, to the extinguishment of the principal of the State debt.

On motion of Mr. Calvert,

Ordered, that the committee on Ways and Means, be directed to report to this House, the alterations necessary in the laws relative to the sale of real estate for taxes, in order to enforce such sale.

On motion of Mr. Hopkins,

Leave was granted Messrs. Hopkins, Yellott, and Stephenson, to introduce a supplement to an act entitled, an act providing for an additional pole in the 2nd election district of Harford county, to be held in the town of Have de Grace.

Mr. Hammill submitted the following resolution:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore, be and he is hereby authorised to pay to Mary Jones, the widow of Nicholas Jones, a soldier of the Revolution the half pay of a private, from and after the seventh day of June 1835;
