

Mr. Johnson, chairman of the committee on Ways and Means, reported a bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Lemuel Dunbracco, collector of the State taxes in Queen Anne's county, for the year 1842;

Mr. Thomas of Talbot, reported a bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to incorporate the Maryland Steam Boat Company;

Mr. Yellott, chairman of the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, reported a bill entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act for the relief of sundry insolvent debtors;

Mr. Thomas, of Saint Mary's, reported a bill entitled, an act to provide for the erection of an additional tobacco warehouse in the city of Baltimore;

Mr. Thomas, of Saint Mary's, also reported a bill entitled, an act relating to the inspection of tobacco in the city of Baltimore, and

Mr. Potter, from the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, made a favorable report upon the bill from the Senate, entitled, an act for the relief of the devisees of Cornelius Howard;

Which were severally read the first, and by a special order the second time, severally passed and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Thomas, of Saint Mary's, chairman of the committee on Inspections, to which was referred the bill reported by Mr. Weems, entitled, a further supplement to the act authorising the appointing of inspectors and wood corders, and to regulate the cording of wood brought to the city of Baltimore, reported the same with the following amendment:

Amendment proposed.

Strike out the second section of the bill;

Which amendment was read and assented to.

The said bill was then read the second time as amended, passed and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Thomas, of Saint Mary's, chairman of same committee, to which was referred the bill from the Senate, entitled, an additional supplement to the act entitled, an act to authorise the Governor and Council of Maryland, to appoint the inspectors of flour for this State, passed at December session 1825, ch. 174, reported the same with the following amendments:

Amendments proposed.

In the 6th line strike out "not."

In the 7th line strike out "less than."

The said amendments having been read and assented to;

The said bill was passed with the proposed amendments and returned to the Senate.

On motion of Mr. Calvert,

(Seconded by two other members that voted in the majority,) the House reconsidered their vote upon the bill reported by him, entitled, a further supplement to an act entitled, an act to incorporate a company for the purpose of cutting and making a canal between the river Delaware and the Chesapeake bay;
