The journal of yesterday was read.

The bill entitled, an act to allow further time to Francis Stephens, of Calvert county, to execute his bond for the year 1844 ;  
And the bill entitled, an act to separate the school fund of Howard District, from that of Anne Arundel county ;

Were sent to the senate.

The bill from the Senate entitled, an act to make valid and sufficient a certain acknowledgment of a deed therein mentioned ;

Was returned to the Senate.

Mr. McKaig presented the petition of Margaret McKinley, of Allegany county, praying for an amendment to the act of 1833, ch. 32 ;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice.

Mr. Carroll presented the memorial of A. P. Giles, Doctor J. J. Troup and one hundred and fifty-eight other citizens, praying the passage of a law making riotous and outrageous acts committed within five miles of the city of Baltimore, a misdemeanor, punishable by fine and imprisonment; at the discretion of the court, according to the aggravated circumstances of the case ;
