

Mr. Hammill reported a bill entitled, a supplement to the act of December session 1842, ch. 180, entitled, an act to incorporate a company, to make a turnpike road from some point on the National road, at or west of the town of Cumberland, thence by the nearest and most practicable route through any part of Allegany county, so as to intersect the North Western Turnpike Road of Virginia;

Mr. Ligon reported a bill entitled, an act to allow the clerk of Howard District court, further time to send up to the Court of Appeals a record therein mentioned;

Mr. Franklin reported a bill entitled, an act to lay open and make public a road in Worcester county, and

Mr. Spencer reported a bill entitled, an act for the benefit of the securities of Frederick Wilson, former Register of Wills of Kent county;

Which were severally read the first and by a special order the second time, severally passed and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Hopkins reported a bill entitled, an act to authorise Charles Brown, Henry Moore and Reuben Thompson, to pilot vessels between Have de Grace and Swan Point;

Which was read the first and by a special order the second time;

Mr. Stephenson moved to lay said bill on the table;

Determined in the negative.

The question then recurred and was put,

"Shall the said bill pass?"

Resolved in the affirmative
