

to Mr. Lynch moved to amend said bill by striking out all after the enacting clause of the bill, and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

That John T. Schley, Charles H. Burkhart and George Schlosser be, and they are hereby authorised and appointed, or a majority of them, commissioners, to lay off a new election district out of those parts of the Creagerstown and Frederick election districts contiguous to each other, and to make choice of a place in the said new election district so laid off at which the election shall be held, having due regard to the accommodation of persons attendant upon such elections; and the said commissioners shall on or before the third Monday in June, 1844, deliver to the clerk of Frederick county court, a description in writing under their hands and seals, specifying plainly the boundaries and number of the election district, so laid off by them; and also the place where the election for such district shall be held; and the said clerk shall record the same in the records of said county, and transmit a copy thereof to the Governor.

Sec. 2. And be it enacted, That the sheriff of Frederick county, shall give notice of the place of holding the election in such election district so laid off anew, by causing the same to be inserted in one or more newspapers printed in Frederick county, once a week for at least two months, previous to holding the election in October 1844.

Sec. 3. And be it enacted, That if any of the commissioners named in this act shall die, remove out of the county or refuse to accept his appointment before the first Monday of April next, the remaining commissioners are hereby authorised and directed to fill such vacancy or vacancies.

Sec. 4. And be it enacted, That each commissioner shall be entitled to receive at the rate of two dollars per day, for every day he shall act in the discharge of the duties imposed on him by the provisions of this act, to be assessed and levied by the levy court of Frederick county, as other county charges are, which said sum when levied and collected, shall be paid over as other county charges are.

Sec. 5. And be it enacted, That the inhabitants of said district shall be in all respects entitled to all the rights, liberties and privileges held or to be held and enjoyed by the other election districts in said county, except the right to elect a member of the levy court, until the October election in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-five."

Resolved in the affirmative.

The question then recurred and was put,

"Shall the said bill pass?"

Resolved in the affirmative.

And the bill sent to the Senate.

On motion of Mr. Reeder,

Ordered, That it be entered on the journal, that if he had been present, he should have voted against the passage of the bill enti-
