

Sec. 4. And be it enacted, That this act shall have no effect until the said company shall bind itself by a bond to be by them executed, to pay to the board of commissioners of Harford county, within ten years from the passage of this act, the amount of all such damages and expenses as may have been heretofore incurred by said county in laying out roads under the tenth section of the act passed at December session 1815, ch. 48, with interest from the time that such damages and expenses may have been paid by said county, this section to have no effect, if said company shall have completed twenty miles of their roads by the first day of January 1846."

Which was read.

Mr. Stephenson moved that the House adjourn :

Determined in the negative.

The question then recurred and was put on the amendment offered by Mr. Yellott, and

Determined in the negative.

On motion of Mr. Yellott,

So the amendment was rejected.

Mr. Stephenson then moved to amend said bill by adding at the end thereof the following proviso :

"Provided, That if the said company claims the benefit of this act, then said company shall not charge tolls on more than ten miles of said road, nor shall the said company charge more than half the amount of toll authorised by their original charter."

Mr. Phelps (being in the Chair.)

Mr. Watson (the Speaker,) moved the previous question.

Mr. Yellott moved for a call of the House.

Mr. Stephenson moved that the House adjourn ;

Resolved in the affirmative.

And the House accordingly adjourned until to-morrow morning nine o'clock.
