Mr. Lynch from the majority of the select committee, to which was referred the memorial of the Independent Hose and of the Junior Fire Company of Frederick city, asking for the passage of a certain law therein stated, reported unfavorably thereon;

Mr. Buckey from the select committee, made an unfavorable report upon the petition of sundry citizens of Frederick county, in relation to the commissioners of the tax for said county;

Mr. Naill from the select committee, to which was referred the petition of Abraham Getzendanner and others, citizens of Frederick county, in relation to a road therein mentioned, reported unfavorably thereon, and asked to be discharged from the further consideration of the subject;
