So the House refused to lay said bill on the table.

Mr. Stewart moved to strike out the fourth section of the bill ; Resolved in the affirmative.

So the fourth section of the bill was stricken out.

Mr. Murray then moved to strike out the 5th, 6th, 7th and 8th sections of the bill.

Mr. Chapman moved to amend said bill by striking out from the 6th section, 10th line, printed bill the following words,

“And should there still be a deficiency to meet the interest due to the creditors aforesaid, the Treasurer shall take and apply to the payment of such deficiency, so much of the school fund as may be necessary for the purpose, excepting always such part or portion of said school fund as is or may be appropriated to the tuition of the indigent blind ; provided, that in no case shall the school fund be used to pay the interest on the sinking fund,”

Also to strike out from the 18th line the words,

“Or to use any part of the school fund,”

And also from the 19th line the words

“The school fund first.”

Which amendment was accepted by Mr. Carey, and adopted by the House.

Mr. Stephenson moved the previous question, and being demanded by a majority of the members present.
