Referred to the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice. The bill reported by Mr. McKaig, entitled an act to incorporate the German Union Beneficial Society of Cumberland, was taken up for consideration;

Read the second time and passed.

The resolution submitted by Mr. McKaig, on 30th ultimo, in relation to furnishing editors of newspapers with copies of the journal, at the expense of the State, was taken up for consideration;
