

On the question being put,
 "Will the House accept the substitute?"

It was determined in the negative.

So the bill was passed, and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Murray, submitted the following resolution,

"Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That bill No. 74, reported by Mr. Johnson; bill No. 78, reported by Mr. Wootten; and bill No. 79, reported by Mr. Thomas, of Talbot, be spread upon the journal, and published for the information of the people, in two newspapers printed in the city of Baltimore, once a week for three weeks, and one newspaper in each county of the State where a newspaper is published, under the direction of the Governor."

Which was read the first and by a special order the second time,

Mr. Phelps, moved to amend said resolution, by inserting, after the words "Mr. Thomas, of Talbot," the words, "and all rejected bills;"

Determined in the negative.

Mr. Potter, moved to amend said resolution, by striking out "Governor," and inserting "Treasurer;"

Determined in the negative.

Mr. Chapman, moved to amend said resolution by striking out "Governor," and inserting "Chief Clerk;"

Determined in the negative.

The question then recurred and was put,

"Will the House assent to the resolution?"
