and income tax, levied, or to be levied for the use of the State, as provided in the first section of the said act of December Session, 1842, chapter 189;

Which was read the first time, and

Ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Johnson, chairman of the committee on Ways and Means,

also submitted the following resolution:

Resolved, as the sense of this General Assembly, that the public interest will be promoted, if his Excellency the Governor, in the exercise of the discretion conferred upon him by the 8th, section of the act of 1842, chapter 269, shall forbear to put in suit the bonds of the collectors of the direct tax, for the enstalment due on the 1st of September last, until the 15th of the ensuing month of April, unless, in the judgement of the Governor, the ultimate security of the monies due the State, shall be endangered by such forbearance.

Which was read the first time,

Mr. Johnson moved a suspension of the rules for the purpose of making said resolution the order of the day for to-morrow the 6th, instant:

Determined in the negative.

Mr. Kilgour chairman of the committee on Claims, to which was referred the memorial of J. P. Wolfe, of Pennsylvania, asking compensation for services in arresting Adam Hellman or Horn, reported unfavorably thereon;

Which was read the first, and by a special order the second

time, and concurred in.

Mr. Kilgour chairman of the committee on Claims, to which was referred the memorial of Dennis Pumphrey, asking that the balance due him for the apprehension of Williams, may be paid, reported unfavorably thereon;

Which was read the first and second time by special order.

Mr. Calvert offered as a substitute for said report the following: Resolved, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the treasurer be authorised and directed to pay Dennis Pumphrey or order, the sum of fifty-two dollars and fourteen cents, being amount of balance due him under the proclamation of the Governor for the arrest of James Williams.

Which was read.

On the question being put,

Will the House accept the substitute?

It was determined in the negative.

The question then recurred and was put, on concurring in the report of the committee, and

Determined in the affirmative.

Mr. Phelps chairman of the the committee on Retrenchment,

submitted the following reports:

Resolved, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the resolution No. 15, passed at December session 1833, be and the same is hereby rescinded.
