

MEMBERS OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY—

Leave granted to report a bill to regulate the itinerant charges of, and the officers thereof 152; bill reported, passed and sent to the senate 465; returned passed and ordered to be engrossed 521.

Order adopted, that no; be allowed to speak more than thirty minutes, on any subject 437.

Order adopted, that the clerk forward to each, after the adjournment of the Legislature, the journal and public documents, which may not have been printed at the adjournment 508.
