

**MESSAGE**—From the Governor, transmitting a communication from the President of the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad Company, relative to the rate of fare on the Washington branch—a copy of a resolution of the Legislature of S. Carolina, relative to the annexation of Texas—and a communication from the American Peace Society 101.

To the senate, nominating Henry W. Fitzhugh, as a director in the Mechanic's Bank of Baltimore, in place of Wm. H. Gatchell, who declined the appointment 101; message reconsidered, time for the election changed and again agreed to 105; sent to the senate 106; reply received, concurring 111.

From the senate, accompanying the bills for making a certain road in Prince George's county, giving the reasons of the senate for rejecting the same 139.

To the senate, requesting a return of the bill for the protection of oysters in the waters of this State 150; sent to the senate 151; reply, accompanying the bill 168.

Message from the Governor, transmitting a letter from the State's wharfinger in Baltimore 190.

To the senate, proposing a joint committee to wait on the Governor to request him to sign and seal the engrossed bills, adopted 287; sent to the senate 292; reply received altering the time and concurring 316.

To the senate, requesting a reconsideration of the bill in relation to pension granted by this State, adopted 301; sent to the senate 304.

Message to the senate, requesting a reconsideration of the act regulating the removal of causes for trial from one county to another, adopted 356; sent to the senate 357.

Message from the Governor covering certain resolutions of the legislature of Virginia 389.

To the senate, asking a reconsideration of the bill to regulate the issuing of licenses in the consolidated lotteries, adopted and sent to the senate 411.

From the senate, proposing a joint committee to contract for the printing of the laws 421; reply proposed, and a substitute offered therefor 422; which was adopted, passed, and sent to the senate 452.

From the Governor, covering resolutions of the legislature of Massachusetts, relative to French depredation previous to the convention of 1800, 430.

To the senate, proposing a joint committee to wait on the Governor and request him to attend to sign and seal the laws, adopted and sent to the senate 435; reply received, concurring 469.
