

SCHOOL FUND—

Bill reported, to authorise a certain portion of the, belonging to Caroline and Dorchester counties, to be applied for the benefit of a Midway school, in Caroline county, near the line between it and Dorchester, passed and sent to the senate 454; returned passed, and ordered to be engrossed 483.

SEARGEANT-AT-ARMS—J. M. P. Broadwater, chosen the, 5.

SECRETARY OF STATE—Resolutions that the, during the recess of the Legislature, as far as practicable, ascertain the amount of imports and exports of Maryland in the aggregate, and also, the amount of every species of produce raised in the State, since the year 1790, annually and report the same to the next Legislature, and making it the duty of the, to make a similar annual report, laid on the table 253.

SEDUCTION—Leave to report a bill to make, a criminal offence 147.

Bill to punish, and to afford more adequate civil remedy for the injury, ordered to be printed 465; referred to the next General Assembly 535.

Petition of citizens of Washington county, for the passage of such a law 222.

SEIN HAULERS—Petition of citizens of Talbot county, praying a law to prevent Philadelphia and Baltimore, from hauling their seines in the creeks and inlets in Great Choptank, Miles and Wye rivers, referred to the Talbot county and Baltimore city delegations 112.

Petition of citizens of Talbot county, for a law to prevent, or fishermen of other States from fishing within the waters of this State, referred to the Talbot, Caroline and Dorchester delegations 112; similar petition presented and referred 172.

SELBY, JESSE—Leave granted to report a bill to allow, to hold and retain a negro in this State 330; bill reported, passed and sent to the senate 341; returned passed with amendments, which are assented to and the bill ordered to be engrossed 356.

SEMMES, BENEDICT I.—Delegate appeared 3.

SENATORS—Leave granted to report a bill to alter the constitution so as to reduce the term of service of State, and to provide for the election of one-third of the, annually, referred 293; unfavorable report 358.

SENATOR, UNITED STATES—Message to the senate proposing to go into the election of a, and nominating James Alfred Pearce, adopted and sent to the senate 21; reply concurring therein 21; proceed to ballot, and James A. Pearce elected 23.
