

WAYS AND MEANS—

The committee on, directed to enquire into the expediency and practicability of so modifying the law of 1842, chapter 301, "to sell the State's interest in the internal improvement companies and to pay the debts of the State," so as speedily if possible to effect a sale of the State's interest in said internal improvement works, and to apply the proceeds of such sale, to the discharge of the State's liabilities 30; order submitted to instruct the committee to report such a bill 262; adopted 310.

The committee on, directed to enquire into the expediency of disposing of the different bank stocks held by the State, and appropriating the proceeds thereof, to the extinguishment of the principal of the State debt 44; resolutions reported 284; taken up 455; laid on the table 458.

The committee on, directed to enquire and report what alterations are necessary in the law to enforce the sale of real estate for taxes 44.

The committee on, directed to enquire into the propriety of so modifying the income tax law, so as to apply the assessment to all sums of \$500, instead of \$200, 48; report unfavorably thereon 59.
