The Clerk of the Senate returned the resolutions in relation to the bridges across the Eastern Branch of the Potomac; and

The resolution in relation to the bond of the Treasurer elect;

Severally endorsed, "assented to," and

Severally ordered to be engrossed; also,

The bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act tor the classification of the business of the county court of Washington county, passed at December session 1842, chapter 233;

Endorsed, "will pass," and the bill ordered to be engrossed;

And delivered the following bills, originated in and passed by the Senate, viz:

A bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to provide for the purchase of land, and the erection theron of an Alms House, in Allegany county, passed at December session 1832, chapter 244;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. McKaig, Smith and Hammill.

And a bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act passed at December session 1805, chapter 92, incorporating the town of Cumberland in Allegany county;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Fitzpatrick, McKaig and Smith.

The hour having arrived for taking up the order of the day, the house resumed the consideration of the bill reported by Mr. Potter, chairman of the select committee entitled, an act to divide the State into six congressional districts.

Mr. Murray moved to amend said bill, by stricking out from the word "six" in the fourth line, first section, to the end of said section, and inserting in lieu thereof the following, and that the order of the day be postponed, and the amendment printed.

"That Saint Mary's, Charles, Calvert, Prince George's and Montgomery counties, constitute the first district.

That Allegany, Washington and Frederick counties, shall constitute the second district.

That Carroll county, wards 12, 13 and 14 of Baltimore city, as now known, and Anne Arundel county, shall constitute the third district.

That Wards 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, as now known, of the city of Baltimore, shall constitute the fourth district.

That Baltimore, Harford, Cecil and Kent counties, shall constitute the fifth district.

And that Queen Anne's, Caroline, Talbot, Dorchester, Somerset and Worcester, snall constitute the sixth district, that each district shall be entitled to elect one representative to Congress."
