Mr. Kilgour reported a bill entitled, an act to fix the place of holding elections in the fourth election district, in Montgomery county;

Which was read the first, and by a special order the second

time, passed, and sent to the Senate.

On motion of Mr. Powder,

The House took up for consideration the bill reported by Mr. Chapman, chairman of the committee on Corporations, entitled, an act to incorporate the trustees of Saint Mary's Church, in Carroll county, with the following amendment;

Strike out in the 6th section first line the word "day," and in-

sert "Monday,"

The amendment having been assented to;

The said bill was read the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Yellott, chairman of the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, to which was referred the bill from the Senate, entitled, an act to make valid a certain deed therein mentioned, reported the same without amendment;

The said bill was then read the first and by a special order the

second time, passed, and returned to the Senate.

Mr Cropper chairman of select committee to which was referred the bill from the Senate entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act to amend the act of December session, 1840, chapter 223, reported the same without amendment;
