

Mr. Worthington, of Baltimore county, presented the petition of sundry citizens of Baltimore county, in relation to the weighing of hay and straw in the city of Baltimore;

Which was read, and referred to the Baltimore city and county delegations.

Mr. Hollyday, of Cecil, presented the petition of Eli Coulson, of Cecil county, praying the passage of an act supplementary to the act of Assembly passed at December session 1831, ch. 205;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice.

Mr. Ghiselin, chairman of the committee on Colored Population, made an unfavorable report upon the petition of Joseph Brown, of Philadelphia, praying to remove certain negro slaves from the State of Delaware into this State;

Which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The Speaker announced the appointment of the following committee, under the order of the House, to inspect the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal and Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road, from Dam No. 6, Messrs. Clarke, Polk, Spencer, Frazier, Rogers, Harris, and Potter.

The bill reported by him, entitled, an act to provide for the completion of the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal to Cumberland, and for other purposes, was made the order of the day for Monday week next.

Mr. Bouchel reported a bill entitled, an act authorising Sylvester Roe, of Cecil county, to bring into this State a negro slave named Emma from the State of Delaware;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Colored Population.

Mr. Hammill from the select committee, to which was referred the bill from the Senate, entitled, an act for the relief of Samuel Luman of Allegany county, reported the same without amendment;

Which was read the first and by a special order the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

The House took up for consideration the bill entitled, an act to reduce the per diem of the judges and clerks of elections in Frederick, Carroll and Anne Arundel counties.

Said bill was recommitted.

Mr. Ford, of Queen Anne's, reported a bill entitled, an act to extend the time of Thomas W. DeCoursey, former collector of Queen Anne's county, to complete his collections;

Which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.
