The several amounts paid the Messrs. Barings, on account of their advances, except one and the last of \$27,957.55, will be found in the statement accompanying the letter of the Commissioner of Loans, which reported the balance then due to be \$27,957.55, and that amount was remitted to him on the 31st October last

Copies of the account current of the Messrs. Barings, for the years 1840, '41 and '42, furnished by the Commissioner of Loans and of his letter enclosing the same are herewith transmitted, as also a continuation of the account from 10th December, 1842, to 31st December, 1843, received from T. W. Ward, Esq., attorney of the Messrs. Barings in this Country.
