Which was read, laid on the table, and

On motion of Mr. Ghiselin,

Ordered to be printed.

On motion of Mr. Thomson,

The House took up for consideration, the bill entitled, an act to incorporate the trustees of the Evangelical Lutheran Congregation of Taneytown, in Carroll county;

The amendments reported to said bill from the committee on Corporations, having been read the second time were assented to.

On motion of Mr. Calvert.

Said bill was further amended by adding at the end thereof the following as an additional section.

"And be it enacted, That the Legislature reserves the right to

alter, amend or repeal this charter at pleasure;"

The said bill was then read the second time as amended, passed, and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Johnson, of Frederick, submitted the following resolutions:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That V. C. Saunders, and J. W. Wildman be, and they are hereby authorised, and privileged to use the West Wing of the Barracks in Fredericktown, and the grounds thereto attached, for a military school, and for no other use or purpose whatever, with the necessary rights and privileges for that purpose,

Resolved, That the sum of money heretofore paid, as a salary to the Armorer at Frederick, be, and the same is hereby appropriated, and ordered to be paid to the commissioners hereinafter named, for the term of two years, and not after the expiration of that period, if the said V. C. Saunders and J. W. Wildman, shall so long continue to keep said school in consideration of their duly
