Which was read and referred to the committee on Ways and Means.

Mr. Gallagher presented the memorial of B. H. Richardson, Columbus O'Donnell, James Harwood, and others, praying for the passage of an act to incorporate the Mutual Fire Insurance Company of Baltimore;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Corpora-

tions.

Mr. Morsell presented the memorial of sundry citizens of the 3rd election district, in Calvert county, in relation to the license laws;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Ways

and Means.

On motion of Mr. Freeman,

Leave was granted the Charles county delegation, to bring in a bill authorising Samuel Cox, of Charles county, to bring into this State, from the District of Columbia, a negro girl named Ellen.

On motion of Mr. Stansbury, of Balt. city,

Ordered, That the committee on Inspections, be instructed to inquire into the expediency of repealing so much of the 4th section of the act entitled, an act providing for the appointment of lime inspectors, and prescribing their duties, passed December session 1839, ch. 290, as relates to the inspection of lime in barrels and hogsheads.

The clerk of the Senate returned the bill entitled, an act to authorise the burgess and commissioners of Taneytown, to sell cer-

tain property therein mentioned;

Also, the bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to establish primary schools in the Upper Election district of Caroline county, passed at December session 1841, chapter 187;

Also, the bill entitled, an act to extend the time of Thomas W. DeCoursey, former collector of Queen Anne's county to com-

plete his collections;

Also, the bill entitled, an act for the relief of Mary Burke and Elizabeth Burke of Cecil county, authorising the county commissioners of said county, to make an annual levy for their maintenance and support;

Severally endorsed, "will pass," and the bills severally ordered

to be engrossed.

Also, the bill entitled, a supplement to an act for the benefit of the crier of Kent county court;

Endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendment,"

Which amendment was read the first and by a special order the second time, "assented to," and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

Endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendment,"

Which amendment was read the first and by a special order the second time.
