So the bill was passed.

Mr. Archer moved to reconsider the vote of the House upon said bill, which motion (not being seconded by two other members that voted in the affirmative,) the motion was not sustained.

The said bill was then sent to the Senate.

Mr. Williams, of Somerset, reported a bill entitled, an act to make valid the proceedings of Edward M. Wise, Esq., a justice of the peace of Somerset county;

Which was read the first, and by a special order the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

On motion of Mr. Calvert,

The House took up for consideration, the bill reported by him entitled, an act for the relief of A. H. C. Heiskell, of Prince George's county;

The said bill was then read the second time by special order, passed, and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Poole from the select committee, reported a bill entitled, an act to reduce the per diem of the judges and clerks of election in Frederick and Carroll counties;

Which was read the first and by a special order the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

The bill reported by Mr. Goldsborough entitled, an act to repeal a part of the seventh section of an act passed at December session 1836, ch. 150;

Was taken up for consideration,

Read the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

On motion of Mr Morsell,

The House took up for consideration the amendment proposed by the Senate to the bill entitled, an act for the relief of Zachariah Sunderland, of Calvert county;

The said amendment was then read the second time, "assented to." and the bill ordered to be engrossed.
