Determined in the negative.

"Shall the said bill pass?"

Resolved in the affirmative, and the bill sent to the senate.

Ordered, That leave be granted to withdraw from the files of the House, the petition of Mary Norris, of the city of Baltimore.

On motion of Mr. Harrington,

Leave was granted the Talbot county delegation, to bring in a bill to allow William Rose, former collector of Talbot county, further time to complete his collections.

Mr. Springer reported a bill entitled, an act authorising Mary D. Cormis, of the city of Baltimore, to bring into this State, a negro slave from Virginia, named Georgianna;

Which was read the first and by a special order the second time, passed and sent to the senate.
