Which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Johnson, of Anne Arundel, reported a bill entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act to give to the Chancellor and county courts, as courts of equity, jurisdiction in cases of divorce, passed at December session, 1841, chapter 262;

Which was read, and

On motion of Mr. Johnson, of A. A.

Referred to the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice.

On motion of Mr. Stewart,

The House took up for consideration the bill reported by him, entitled, an act to consecrate the piece of ground at Ellicott's Mills, therein mentioned, for the use and purpose of a grave yard.

Mr. Calvert moved to amend said bill by striking out in the last line of 1st section the words consecrate; and

Determined in the negative.

The said bill was then read a second time, passed, and sent to the Senate.

The bill reported by Mr. Hughes, entitled, an act authorising the commissioners of Charles county, to levy a sum of money for the repair of the bridge at Allen's Fresh, in said county;

Also, the bill reported by him, entitled, an act in relation to primary schools in Charles county;

And, the bill from the Senate, entitled, an act to repeal an act entitled, an act to encourage the destruction of crows in this State, passed at December session 1831, chapter 227, so far as relates to St. Mary's county;

Were severally taken up for consideration, read the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

The bill reported by Mr. Calvert, entitled, an act to regulate the itinerant charges of members elect of the General Assembly of Maryland, the elector for President and Vice President, and for other purposes;

Was taken up for consideration.

Mr. Thomas moved to refer said bill to the committee on Retrenchment;

Determined in the negative.
