And Mr. Walker presented a petition of sundry citizens of Baltimore county, praying for the passage of a law to prevent the sale of spirituous liquors;

Which were severally read and referred to the committee on Ways and Means.

Mr. Sprigg, of Allegany county, presented two petitions of sundry citizens of Allegany county, praying that the banks of the State, may be allowed the privilege of continuing the issue of their small notes;

Which were severally read and referred to the committee on Corporations.

Mr. Sprigg, of Allegany, also, presented the petition of sundry citizens of Allegany county, praying that the acts of John Alder, late constable, be made val d;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice.

Mr. Hollyday, of Cecil, presented the memorial of General Thomas M. Forman, of Cecil county, praying for the change of the name of Laura Ogle Oldham, of said county, to Laura Ogle;

Which was read and referred to the Cecil county delegation.

The clerk of the Senate delivered a bill originated in and passed by the Senate, entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to authorise the approval of the bonds of the several clerks of the several county courts in this State, passed at December session 1838, chapter 124;

Which was read.

Mr. Johnson, of Anne Arundel, moved that the House suspend the rule, and that said bill be read a second time by special order;

Resolved in the affirmative.

The said bill was then read the first and by a special order the second time, passed, and returned to the Senate.

Mr. Stewart presented the petition of sundry citizens of Howard District in Anne Arundel county, praying an alteration in the primary school laws;

Which was read and referred to the Anne Arundel county delegation.

Mr. Gallagher presented the memorial of Robert Murray and others, of the city of Baltimore, praying to be reinstated in certain privileges;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice.

Mr. Ware presented the memorial of John Gambrel and others, praying for further restrictions in the sale of intoxicating liquors;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Ways and Means.
