Leave was granted the committee on Corporations, to bring in a bill to continue the act entitled, an act to incorporate the Baltimore and Chesapeake Steam Towing Company.

On motion of Mr. Potter,

Leave was granted the Caroline county delegation, to bring in a bill for the relief of Margaret Parr, of the city of Baltimore.

On metion of Mr. Gallagher,

Leave was granted the committee on Corporations, to bring in a bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to incorporate the President and Directors of the Baltimore Gunpowder Company;
