## TUESDAY, February 4th, 1845.

The House met. Present at the call of the roll the following members:

On motion of Mr. Gallagher,

The House dispensed with the reading of the journal.

Mr. Gallagher presented the petition of Ann Durham, of the city of Baltimore, praying for a pension, in consideration of the services rendered by her husband in the war of the Revolution;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Pensions and Revolutionary Claims.

Mr. Walker presented the petition of sundry citizens of Baltimore county, praying the passage of an act to prevent the sale of spirituous liquors;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Ways and Means.

Mr. Harrison presented the petition of Dr. Jonathan Crane, and sundry other citizens of Queen Anne's county, praying the passage of a law, to fix the salaries of the clerks and registers of the several counties, and city of Baltimore, of State attorneys and other State officers, and to impose a tax upon the same;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Ways and Means.
