Severally endorsed, "will pass," and the bills severally ordered to be engrossed.

Also, the bill entitled, an act for the benefit of John G Black,

of Kent county;

Endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendment,"

Which amendment was read the first and by a special order the second time, "assented to," and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

And delivered a resolution originated in and passed by the Scnate, relative to the disposal of certain furniture in the government house;

Which was read,

Mr. Potter moved to refer said resolution to the committee on Retrenchment.

Mr. Calvert moved that said resolution be read a second time by special order;

Determined in the negative.

The question was then taken on the motion of Mr. Potter, and Determined in the affirmative.

On motion of Mr. Lynch,

Leave was granted the Anne Arundel county delegation, to bring in a bill to make valid a deed from Richard Dorsey and wife, to Daniel Lamborn;

Mr. Johnson, chairman of the committee on Ways and Means, reported a bill entitled, an act imposing duties on promissory notes, bills of exchange, specialities and other instruments of writing, to aid in paying the debts of the State, and

Mr. Hollyday, of Cecil, reported a bill entitled, an act supplementary to an act entitled, an act concerning crimes and punish-

ments, passed at December session 1818, ch. 157;

Which were severally read the first time, and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Long, chairman of the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, reported a bill entitled, an act to confirm an act to amend the Constitution and Form of Government of this State, prohibiting any money being drawn from the Treasury of the State, but in consequence of appropriations made by law;

Which was read the first, and by a special order the second

time, passed and sent to the Senate.

The bill from the Senate entitled, an act to authorise the measurement of cord wood at Jeffersonville and Principio Furnace, or within one mile of either place in Cecil county;

Was taken up for consideration, read the second time, passed

and returned to the Senate.

The bill reported by Mr. Morsell, chairman of the committee on Retrenchment entitled, an act to abolish the office of Examiner General;

added to the sinking fund as soon as received,

Was taken up for consideration;

On motion of Mr. Williams, of Baltimore city, Said bill was ordered to lie on the table.
