

THURSDAY, February 6th, 1845.

The House met. Present at the call of the roll the following members.

Messrs. Chapman, (Spkr.,) Ford, of St. Mary's, Thomas, Tilden, Hollyday, of Kent, Worthington, of A. A., Lynch, Johnson, of A. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The Speaker laid before the House a report from the commissioners of the school fund for St. Mary's county;

Which was read and referred to the St. Mary's county delegation.

The Speaker also, laid before the House a report of the trustees of Newtown academy;

Also, a report of the principal of Charlotte Hall academy;

Which were severally read and referred to the committee on Education.

The Speaker also laid before the House a report from the register of wills of Worcester county, in obedience to an order of the House of Delegates of the 29th ultimo;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Ways and Means.

Mr. Hollyday, of Cecil, presented the memorial of sundry citizens of Cecil county, praying the establishment of an inspection of lumber and the appointment of an inspector at Perryville in said county;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Inspections.

Mr. Rogers presented the petition of sundry citizens of Carroll and Baltimore counties, praying the opening of a road therein mentioned;

Which was read and referred to the delegations from Carroll and Baltimore counties.

Mr. Tall presented the petition of sundry citizens of Dorchester county, in relation to the wood trade with the city of Baltimore;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Tall, Springer, Purnell, Thomas and Maffitt.

Mr. Purnell presented the memorial of John F. Purnell, and other citizens of Worcester county, asking for the passage of a law, for the destruction of crows in said county;

Which was read and referred to the Worcester county delegation.
