

Mr. Stewart reported a bill entitled, an act supplementary to an act passed at December session 1842, ch. 72, entitled, an act relating to Anne Arundel county;

Which were severally read the first, and by a special order the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

The doorkeeper having returned, reported that in obedience to order, he had notified the absent members that their attendance in the House was required.

The House then resumed the consideration of the bill entitled, an act to reduce the salaries of all officers paid out of the State treasury, except salaries fixed by the Constitution.

The question before the House being upon the motion of Mr. Williams, of Baltimore city, to strike out the proviso to the 2nd section of the bill, being in these words "provided, that nothing herein contained, shall be so construed as to effect the salary of the Governor, until the first day of January 1848;"

On the question being put, on said amendment;

It was determined in the affirmative.
