

SATURDAY, February 8th, 1845.

The House met. Present at the call of the roll the following members :

The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The Speaker announced the following message, as having been received on yesterday from the Senate :

The bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Susquehanna Fire Company of Port Deposit, Cecil county ;

Also, the bill entitled, an act to authorise the levy court of Kent county, to administer oaths or affirmations in certain cases therein mentioned ;

Severally endorsed, "will pass," and the bills severally ordered to be engrossed.

Also, the bill entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act for making certain roads in Baltimore and Harford counties, passed at December session 1815, ch. 418 ;

Endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendment,"

Which was read, and

On motion of Mr. Randall,

Referred to the delegations from Harford and Baltimore counties.

Also, the bill entitled, an act to reduce the per diem of the judges and clerks of election in Frederick and Carroll counties ;

Endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendments,"

Which amendments were read the first time, and

On motion of Mr. Poole,

Referred to the delegations from Frederick, Carroll and Cecil counties.

And delivered the following bills originated in and passed by the Senate, viz :

A bill entitled, an act for the relief of John A. Carter, late clerk of Montgomery county court ;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Patterson, Waters and Kilgour.

A bill entitled, an act relating to the removal of equity causes to the court of chancery from the first and sixth judicial districts ;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice.
