

Court of Chancery, and the several county courts exercising chancery jurisdiction.

On motion of Mr. Harrington,

Leave was granted the Talbot county delegation, to bring in a bill to allow Thomas Landin, to sell a house and lot in the town of St. Michael's, Talbot county.

On motion of Mr. Graves,

Ordered, That the Librarian be instructed to deposit with the Historical Society of Maryland, a copy of each of the State publications, where the same may be parted with without detriment to the library.

On motion of Mr. Frazier,

Leave was granted Messrs. Frazier, Hollyday, of Cecil, Patterson, Hughes and Ghiselin, to bring in a bill to rent out real estate, for debts in certain cases.

Mr. Waters presented the petition of Thomas P. Stabler and Isaac Holland, of Montgomery county, praying relief therein mentioned ;

Which was read and referred to the Montgomery county delegation.

Mr. Williams, of Somerset, (seconded by two other members that voted in the majority,) moved to reconsider the vote of the House, upon the bill passed on yesterday entitled, an act to reduce the salaries of all officers paid out of the State treasury, except salaries fixed by the Constitution ;

On the question being put,

"Will the House reconsider their vote ?"

It was determined in the negative.

The said bill was then sent to the Senate.

Mr. McKnett from the select committee, reported a bill entitled, an act explanatory to an act passed at December session 1834, relative to the school funds of Caroline county ;

Mr. Harrington from the select committee, reported a bill entitled, an act to allow Morris O. Colston, late collector of Talbot county, further time to complete his collections ;

Mr. Bowdle from the select committee, reported a bill entitled, an act to condemn and lay off a lot of ground for a public landing through the lands of Col. William Hugulett, on Choptank river in Talbot county, and make a public road therein mentioned ; and

Mr. Stewart from the select committee, reported a bill entitled, an act to allow Charles G. Haslup, further time to complete his collections ;

Which were severally read the first and a by special order the second time, severally passed and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Patterson, chairman of the select committee, to which was referred the bill from the Senate, entitled, an act for the relief of John A. Carter, late clerk of Montgomery county court, made a favorable report on said bill ;

Which was read the first and by a special order the second time, passed, and returned to the Senate.
