So the bill was laid on the table.

Mr. Ware, who has been absent from the House in consequence of domestic affliction, again appeared in the House and resumed his seat.

Mr. Long, chairman of the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, to which was referred the memorial of citizens of Prince George's county vs. hawkers and pedlars, asked to be discharged from the further consideration of the same, and that said memorial be referred to the committee on Ways and Means;

Also, asked to be discharged from the further consideration of the petition of sundry citizens of Allegany county, praying that the acts of John W. Alder, late constable be made valid, and that the said petition be referred to the Allegany county delegation;

Which reports were severally twice read and concurred in.

Also, made an unfavorable report on the following petitions.

A petition of John M. Millard, praying remuneration for loss of a negro man;

Also, a petition of Robert Murray and others, of the city of Baltimore, praying to be reinstated in certain privileges;

Also, the petition of eighty-four citizens of Washington county, praying an alteration in the laws relating to mortgages and bills of sale;

Also, the petition of John Vanlear, jun., John B. Dall, Isaac Long, John Baker, John Corby, S. S. Cunningham and one hundred and forty-five citizens of Washington county, praying for the passage of a law giving justices of the peace for said county, jurisdiction in cases of assaults and battery and for other purposes;

Also, the petition from Doctor Samuel Davis of Harford county, proposing a change in the marriage ceremony and an additional protection to the rights and property of married women, and recommending a change in the banking system of the State;
