

Which was read and referred to the Baltimore city delegation: Mr. Gallagher, chairman of the committee on Corporations, reported a bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Metamora Tribe No. 4 of "the Improved order of Red Men of the State of Maryland."

Mr. Patterson reported a bill entitled, an act to allow Reuben Summers, receiver of Richard R. Waters, late sheriff and collector of Montgomery county, further time to complete his collections.

Mr. Hollyday, of Cecil, reported a bill entitled, an act for the relief of Mary Hasson and James Lile, of Cecil county, and

Mr. Rogers reported a bill entitled, an act to reduce the county expenses of Carroll county;

Which were severally read the first and by a special order the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Sprigg, of Allegany county, from the select committee, to which was referred the bill from the Senate, entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, "an act to authorise the laying out and opening a road in Allegany county, passed at December session 1836, ch. 147, reported the same without amendment;

Which was read.

The said bill was then read the second time by a special order passed and returned to the senate.

Mr. Lynch, from the committee on Corporations, to which was referred the bill from the Senate, entitled, an act to incorporate the Howard Manufacturing company of Maryland, reported the same without amendment;

Which was read.

Mr. Williams, of Baltimore city, moved to amend said bill, by striking out in the last line of the 7th section, these words, "when-ever the public interest may require it," and inserting in lieu thereof the words, "at any time,"

Determined in the negative.

The said bill was then read the second time, passed and returned to the Senate.

Mr. Johnson, of A. A. submitted the following resolution:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the commissioner of loans receive from, and give his receipt to the president or other proper officer of the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal Company, for the coupons now in their possession, and amounting to £21,475 sterling, as appears by the 16th annual report of the said company, dated the 3d June, 1844, and that said coupons when so received be retained by the said commissioner, for the purpose of being cancelled and destroyed, at the time, and manner directed for the cancellations of coupons received in payment of taxes.

Which was read the first and by a special order the second time, "assented to," and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Williams, of Baltimore city, from the select committee, to which was recommitted the bill entitled, a supplement to an act
