

entitled, an act to declare and ascertain the right of citizens of this State to private roads or ways, reported the same with the following amendments:

Amendments proposed.

Strike out in the 8th line of the printed bill the words "levy court or."

Strike out in the 10th line the words "levy court or."

Add a third section:

"Sec. 3. And be it enacted, That the operations of this act shall be confined to Baltimore county ;"

Which were read and "assented to."

The said bill was then read the second time by special order, and passed.

On motion of Mr. Williams, of Baltimore city,

The title of said bill was amended by adding at the end thereof these words, "so far as regards Baltimore county."

The said bill was then sent to the Senate.

The House then resumed the consideration of the unfinished business of yesterday, being the bill reported by Mr. Archer, entitled, an act to amend the Constitution of the State of Maryland, and define and limit the power of the Legislature.

On motion of Mr. Kilgour,

Said bill was ordered to lie on the table.

The bill reported by Mr. Neff, entitled, an act to incorporate the Frostburg coal company ;

Was taken up for consideration ;

Mr. Fitzpatrick moved to amend said bill by inserting after the word "thereafter," in the 2nd line 5th section these words, "upon twenty days notice in the several newspapers in Cumberland and one in Baltimore city."

Mr. Sprigg, of Allegany, moved to amend said amendment by striking out the words "and one in Baltimore city ;"

Determined in the negative.

The question then recurred and was put, on the amendment as offered by Mr. Fitzpatrick ; and

Resolved in the affirmative.

Mr. Fitzpatrick moved further to amend said bill by striking out "the," in the 7th line 5th section, and inserting "two ;"

Resolved in the affirmative,

On motion of Mr. Fitzpatrick,

Said bill was further amended by inserting after the word "existing," in the 29th line 6th section, the words "in Allegany county, or that may hereafter be established according to existing laws."

Mr. Hammill moved further to amend said bill by striking out all after the word "thereafter," in the 2nd line 9th section, to the end of said section.

Mr. Bowie moved as a substitute for said amendment, to amend said section by striking out the words "and shall not be effected
