

Which were severally read and referred to the committee on Ways and Means.

The Speaker laid before the House, the proceedings of a meeting of the regents of the "Newton University ;"

Which was read and referred to the committee on Corporations.

Mr. Harris presented the petition of David White and forty-nine others, praying an alteration in the license law, so far as relates to taverns, grog shops, and other places where intoxicating liquors are sold, and so far as relates to the 6th election district in Cecil county, and

Mr. Hughes presented the petition of John W. Barker and other citizens of Charles county, praying further legislation in regard to hawkers and pedlars ;

Which were read and referred to the committee on Ways and Means.

Mr. Thomson presented the petition of sundry citizens of Carroll and Frederick counties, praying the passage of a law, authorising the commissioners of tax of said counties, to levy a sum of money for purposes therein mentioned ;

Which was read and referred to the Carroll and Frederick county delegations.

Mr. Poole presented the memorial of sundry citizens of Frederick county, praying the passage of a law authorising the levy court of Frederick county, and commissioners of the tax for Carroll county, to levy a sum of money to complete a bridge across Sam's creek ;

Which was read and referred to the Frederick and Carroll county delegations.

Mr. Hollyday, of Kent, presented the petition of George Beck, of Geo. and others, citizens of Kent county, praying for the passage of an act to form an additional school district, in the middle election district ;

Which was read and referred to the Kent county delegation.

Mr. Jump presented the petition of James H. Barwick, and nineteen other citizens of Caroline county, praying for a formation of a new school, to be made out of district number five, and number eight in said county ;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Education.

Mr. Stansbury, of Baltimore city, presented the memorial of sundry citizens of the city of Baltimore, praying for an act of incorporation, by the name and style of the "United Manufacturing Company of Maryland ;"

Which was read and referred to the committee on Corporations.

On motion of Mr. Stewart,

Leave was granted the Anne Arundel and Baltimore county delegations, to bring in a bill to empower the sheriff of Howard District to do certain acts.
